Being part of the team gave him the opportunity to swim in the Adelaide Aquatic pool where Olympic selection trials are held. The selection trials for SASSA and SAPSASA the senior and primary district level competitions were completed at the Interschool Swimming Competition held for the 3<sup>rd</sup> year at the Murray Bridge outdoor 50m pool. The 9 students from year 4 to 8 were incredibly supportive of each other and did their best to compete against some larger schools with bigger teams. 

Students now have clean fresh comfortable benches that have easy clean surfaces and help keep the space to industry standard.

The Thermomix has been another exciting addition to the classroom with many of the senior students being able to access industry specific and up to date technology. Students have experimented super quick chopping of ingredients and mincing chicken for the Meet and Greet Barbecue, making chocolate mousse, custard without having to stir and more. We can already see that this equipment will be an asset to senior classes.





# **Team Sailing**

Sailing has continued at school and team sailing practices are currently on Wednesday afternoons at 3:10pm. Students from 10 years old to year 12 are encouraged to be part of Team Sailing. We also encourage students to practise their sailing on weekends and Wednesday Twilight sailing. #### What is team sailing?

Team sailing is a competition between two teams of sailors. There are three boats in each team. Each boat has one skipper and one crew. One team is identified on the water with jibs (small sail at the front) of the same colour.

Students compete and practise at a regional level. Our region consists of students from the Victor Harbor, Goolwa and Meningie. Our next regional event is planned for March 31<sup>st</sup> and will be held here in Meningie.











## **Children's University**

Have you heard of **Children's University?** It's an innovative program that engages children and young people in exciting, out-of-school learning opportunities to increase their chances for educational achievement and rewards them for taking responsibility for their own learning.



Over the past few years Meningie Area School students have been involved with the Children's University.

Students have recorded the activities they have completed in their out-of-school activities. Sports, reading, crafts, fishing, excursions to zoos and Adelaide, fence repairs, sailing, cooking and many other activities were recorded by the busy students.

It's an innovative program that engages children and young people in exciting, out-of-school learning opportunities to increase their chances for educational achievement and rewards them for taking responsibility for their own learning. Students' hours are logged in their Children's University passports with the help of the school co-ordinator, Mrs Wright.

At Meningie students are asked to return the participation form and the schools contributes student fee to the Children's University organisation. New participants will receive a Children's University Passport and continuing participants will continue building their hours to achieve even more awards.

Students from year 2 at school to 14 year olds are eligible to be part of the award. Mrs Wright is the contact teacher, for any questions and information.

An EdSmart note will be seeing sent home and the forms distributed to all interested families.

#### **School Breakfast Club**

Foodbank SA School Breakfast Program helps to provide healthy, nutritious food to children who turn up to school hungry. Some of our students have to get up early to catch buses, have slept in, or feel peckish after having a run around before school and are able to top up after having an earlier breakfast at home. The Program also helps schools to provide brain food fruit bowls in classrooms for students to consume at school. Foodbank SA delivers breakfast foods to schools free of charge in all regions of South Australia. In 2022 more than 100,000 kilograms of food was distributed and more than 380,000 breakfasts provided in schools around the state.

We know now more than ever families are doing it tough, the latest Foodbank Hunger Report has shown that while a broad range of households are struggling, it is those with children which have been hit harder than others in the past year. Over the past few years South



Australians have faced bushfires, COVID-19, the increased cost of living, significant mortgage increases and now floods making the work schools do to support students with food relief is becoming increasingly important. In Week 2 97 students accessed Breakfast Club, in Week 3 124 students and in Week 4 we had 143 students access Breakfast Club. We provide toast with either jam, vegemite, honey or cheese, fresh fruit and muesli bars or other snacks. Students also are given the opportunity to make a sandwich for their lunch.

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We encourage all students to fill up before school starts as often students who are hungry lose focus in class learning activities. Breakfast Club is open from 8.20am until 8.50am and all students are more than welcome. Breakfast Club also gives older students who are undertaking their Duke of Edinburgh qualification an opportunity to get in some volunteer hours, and also provides an opportunity for students of all year levels to connect socially.

A few parents and community members have asked if they could contribute and we always welcome donations of fresh seasonal fruit, muesli bars, tubs of butter and cheese slices. The Meningie Bakery very kindly supports the school by donating bread.

Please encourage your child/children to drop by Breakfast Club and get a healthy start for the day's learning activities.





Autism Inclusion Teachers are a new, nation-leading initiative that aims to build educator understanding and knowledge around supporting autistic children and young people. You may also hear Autism Inclusion Teachers being referred to as AIT's.

Every public primary school in South Australia will appoint an Autism Inclusion Teacher. Our Autism Inclusion Teacher will take on the role 1 day per week. At Meningie Area School, Abbey Gibbs has been appointed the AIT.



Autism Inclusion Teachers will build their own teaching expertise, knowledge and understanding of autism through engaging in formal learning offerings and participation in the Autism Inclusion Teacher networks. To improve knowledge and practice across the school, Autism Inclusion Teachers will then be encouraged to share their learnings and resources with their colleagues to utilise in teaching autistic children and young people in their own classes. The AIT will not be working directly with students.

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# Wellbeing corner- Screen time and Internet safety

The ABC radio ran a series this week on screen addiction for children this was a follow on from a TV documentary series in 2021 where they discussed the issues around some children and teens spending over a 1/3 of their day looking at a screen.

Current research discusses there are benefits and the guidelines below are unrealistic for most families but they suggest that screen time is beneficial when:

- Co-viewing is the norm- when you watch something with your child
- It is high quality or educational.
- Families use digital tools that create school readiness like e-books, Reading eggs and other literacy, numeracy or science based apps
- Connection through face timing with family members
- Families have a media plan- rules around access to apps- there are laws around social media for under 13-year-olds and some great videos that explain grooming, online safety etc to children and teenagers

A quick Google search shows there is data that discusses the benefits of screens and technology in our lives and the Australian Guidelines for screen time are considered a bit outdated. They can be found in the Australian <u>24-hour movement guidelines</u> for the early years (birth through to five years) and children and young people (5–17 years) (introduced in 2018). These guidelines were developed from systematic reviews of the evidence about the effects of physical activity, sleep and sedentary time (including screen time) on children's development, health and wellbeing. For screen time, the guidelines recommend:

- no screen time for children younger than two years
- no more than one hour per day for children aged 2–5 years.
- no more than two hours of sedentary recreational screen time per day for children and young people aged 5–17 years (not including schoolwork).

Screen time is largely unavoidable. There is some great advice around minimising the impacts of screen time and the light impact on growing brains by using sunlight as a counter tool.

Aiming for at least 15-20 minutes of sunlight in the morning can trigger your brain to release chemicals through the day that will help regulate your sleep cycle and improve the quality of your sleep.

Other tips are turning off the TV when no one is watching so it's not something on in the background. There are apps that limit wifi use or can monitor daily use. Checking the privacy of your child's social media is a priority.

That's why eSafety called on Australians to Connect. Reflect. Protect.

**Reflect** before we act – by taking a moment to consider how what we do and say online may affect others. **Protect** ourselves and others by taking action – by telling family, friends or colleagues about eSafety and how we can help.
