Program) soon. This position will focus on supporting students' readiness to learn through managing the Breakfast Club and Homework Club. If you cannot send lunch for any reason, students can make lunch for themselves at Breakfast Club in the morning.

We are continuing our Berry Street Education Model on "readiness to learn" focus across the school. This includes helping students develop self-regulation. Abbey Gibbs initiated the swings within the Thukabi block to support students' self-regulation and is also developing regulation spaces for students. Staff will also use "check ins" to help students develop awareness of their own readiness to learn and Rachel Neumann and I will be working with our SACE students on "Learning Intentions Plans" to support students to meet their goals.

We will also be working with students to embed our new values: "determination, collaboration, kindness, respect" and ensure they are "lived" within the school community. If you have not got our poster with our new vision, mission, values, motto, and logo, they are available from the front office. Apologies for the delay with the new T-shirts, they should be arriving next week, and we will distribute them to students – please write your child's name on the shirt when they bring it home.

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Junior Artist Summer Display in Alberts Gallery at The Chambers

These paintings have been done during 2023 by students in the Year 5 and 6 Class from Meningie Area School. Students undertook sketching of subjects such as wombats, initially with graphite pencils and charcoal on paper. Experimenting with these materials saw trials and discoveries of mark making, depth of tone, scale and perspective, etc.

Students then accepted the challenge to do a portrait of a person of significance to them. This could be a family member, friend or well-known identity. Again, these students started with basic materials to sketch their subject.

These acrylic paintings on canvas are the final product of this journey of artistic learning in a nurturing weekly pursuit to take risks with use of art materials and creative expression, pushing of personal limits to try and try again, to achieve a result that represents not just a portrait but a journey of discovery in mark making and freedom to explore boosting artistic confidence.

What are the year 8/9/10's doing in this lesson?

Each Wednesday in lessons 3-5, students are working alongside 4 specialised facilitators to imagine, develop, plan and produce an enterprise of their own.

Students will be guided by these facilitators to produce a service or product that aims to increase opportunities for the Meningie Area School community.

Denice Mason (Teacher): Cooking, Craft & Art Wally Schmidt: Welding & Metal Fabrication Group 2:

Caitlin Hattam (Teacher): Horticulture, Aquaculture & Honey Production
Wayne Lehmann: Steer Team, Beef Production & Beef Industry.

On Thursdays in lesson 4, students will be engaging in entrepreneurial learning that is aligned to the Australian Curriculum.

Our experience so far:

Week 1: Weet-Bix Cooking Challenge - Create & Market

Week 2: Immersion Excursion in Murray Bridge

Week 3: Four 50-minute activity rotations run by each facilitator & make facilitator selection.

Week 4: Begin Enterprise Project with chosen facilitator.





3rd = 5 points


4th = 4 points

All other successful competitors = 1 point (eg: make a clear jump or throw but do not finish in the top 6)









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


