Today we also celebrate the life of an amazing woman Lowitja O'Donaghue. Lowitja was born in the far north of South Australia. Lowitja was removed from her family and later sent to Victor Harbor as a servant. She then started working as a nursing aide and was encouraged to train as a nurse. However, she was not accepted and had to fight including lobbying the Premier of the state to be admitted to train at the Royal Adelaide Hospital. She became the first Aboriginal trainee nurse in South Australia. She worked on missions in India and returned to Australia to enter public administration in many areas including health and education. She paved the way for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders

Meningie Area School has a range of communication for parents

Governing Council asked me to clarify communication to families. We understand that there has been considerable change over the past 12 months and we appreciate this may have created some confusion. **EDSMART** – school broadcasts, newsletters and CONSENT forms are sent to your email via EDSMART. If you don't have email please advise our front office and paper forms can be provided. Paper newsletters are also put in the Post Office, Foodland and Community Library.

SMS - short reminders or urgent messages are sent via text.

Newsletters – are published 3 times a term – week 3, 6 and 9. They are sent via EDSMART, posted on the website and hard copies are available at the front office, Community Library and in the community. **Facebook** - posts celebrating learning and reminders are posted.

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Website – the updated website will be live next week. It has general information, key documents and newsletters.

Email – staff use email to communicate information specific to your child. It is the best way to contact individual teachers. Please contact the front office if you need a teachers email address. *Please respect teacher work-life balance only email staff from 8am – 6pm school days.*

FROG - FROG is the Department for Education Learner Management System. Student class programs, resources and information are available to students and families (the parent portal will be activated soon and has a link on the new webpage). The school will transition to this in 2024/2025. Teachers not using FROG will post class notes, resources on Teams which students access through EDPASS (link on webpage).

DOJO – primary staff will use this in 2024 and will transition to FROG in 2025. This is only for celebrating student learning. Please do not use it for attendance or other matters – if the teacher is absent we may not get the message.

Student absences – if your child is absent, please phone the front office and they will enter the absence for the day.

You are welcome to ask for a meeting with teacher(s) at any time. Please feel free to contact us to arrange a meeting.

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Year 7 – 10 Canberra Camp

On Thursday 29th February 2024 parents and caregivers of students in years 7 – 10 would have received a broadcast from the school about the camp.

The camp is booked for Week 9 of Term 2 **Sunday 23/6/24 to Friday 28/6/24 (5 nights, 6 days)** through the tour operator Macquarie Educational Tours the total cost of the camp is \$1,105.50 per student. With PACER (government) rebates and school subsidy, **the cost to families per student is \$450**.

We understand that this is a significant amount of money and are offering various payment options as set out in the commitment to pay and direct debit forms. We ask families to return the forms to the front office by **Friday 15th March 2024**.

If you require hard copy of the documents, please pick one up from the front office.

Students will immerse themselves in the capital and visit many of the sites across the city including:

- Guided Tour of Australian Parliament House
- Museum of Australian Democracy (MoAD)
- National Electoral Education Centre (NEEC)
- Australian War Memorial (AWM)

We will have further details about the accommodation facilities and attractions once the operator has confirmed the itinerary and look forward to sharing this information with you and the students. Students will be traveling by coach bus from Meningie to Canberra and return.

Each year for NAIDOC Celebrations we have had a Pulgi Built by our Local Aboriginal men. The Pulgi from July last year still stands and as the students here at Meningie Area School enjoy playing in the Pulgi we thought it would be great to give it a bit of a tidy up and show students and staff different materials that the Ngarrindjeri people would have used for their shelter. The



first Pulgi was built with materials from a Eucalyptus tree and it has been updated with a Tea Tree, both Materials were strong and easily accessible to the Ngarrindjeri People.

We would like to acknowledge and thank the Ngarrindjeri Lands and Progress Aboriginal Corporation Working on Country workers for their knowledge and work they have done for both of the shelters.
