I am very happy to be leading Meningie Area School for the next 5 years to build on the work we have achieved over the past 3 years: restructuring of the administration; reviewing curriculum structure; redesigning meeting structures to focus on professional learning and co planning; revitalising the school vision, motto, values and logo with full community involvement; improving student engagement through the Berry Street Education Model; and a focus on Entrepreneurial skills and capability development for students.

We are in a teaching shortage, and it is difficult getting TRT's (Temporary Relief Teachers for short term absences), contracts for longer absences and staff.

I would like to thank our regular relievers who are committed to MAS and supporting continuity of learning when teachers are absent:

Beth Cowan – has worked with us for many years and always supports student learning when covering teacher absence.

Sue Prince – has retired to Meningie after a long career in primary education. She has joined us this year and is enjoying getting to know our students and staff.

Declan Laginestra – is a TRT from Adelaide. He has covered longer absences for Lauren McGargill and Caitlin Hattam. He comes from Adelaide and enjoys working at the school and maintaining his fitness with the locals. Declan will continue regular TRT with us in Term 4.

As well as our relievers our staff have picked up additional teaching to cover long term teacher absence to ensure students are not disadvantaged. Please be understanding that staff are extra busy and at times may be less available – particularly our leaders.

Abbey Gibbs has gone on leave a little earlier than expected and we are very pleased to announce Prue Boland will step in at the start of Term 4 and for 2025 as Assistant Principal Wellbeing and Intervention & Support. Prue is a very experienced teacher with a wealth of knowledge and understanding of wellbeing and student needs. We look forward to working with Prue.

Tamika Williams, past Meningie Area School student will return from Maternity Leave in Term 4 and take on classes from Lauren McGargill who will go on Maternity Leave. We look forward to welcoming Tamika as a teacher at Meningie Area School.

We currently are processing 5 teaching positions, a grounds and finance position. These processes take a little time in our system, but we are hoping to make some announcements in the Week 9 newsletter. So very busy times in staffing.

Staff collectively contributed to a fantastic and successful Enterprise Expo. This was a great family and community event which showcased student R-12 learning and capabilities. 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#### Citizen of Science

Monday 26th August students from years 5-7 left school to test water at Long Point, Narrung with a team from the Landscape board. They also visited Pam's turtle fence in the shallows towards Narrung. They learned about the protection of the turtle eggs from foxes. Our last stop was the Narrung jetty where they sampled water, recorded frog calls and learnt about local birdlife.

The focus for the excursion was Real World Problems in Science for the year 8 class. Citizen Science helps us to participate with scientists and local organisations to support our native wildlife. Key projects like the 1 million turtle community program, Frog watch and Water watch are all projects students and families can be involved with using the QR codes.





One problem around our community is the foxes finding and digging up turtle nests. The problem with this is they eat the eggs and turtles take a long time to produce eggs. We can help this problem by making "Turtle safety zones" which are fenced off areas where turtles can make nests and not worry about the foxes destroying their nests. By Tayla & Oscar

Our last stop was out at Narrung and our frog expert was Alice. We tried to hear frogs calling, and then tried to identify frogs that we here in our back yard and frogs that we had never ever heard of before in our life. We sat a tablet in the grass next to the reeds and videoed a 3-5 minute video to send to scientists to study more about the sound of some frogs and identify the types of frogs that live there. 




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#### Jallarah Friends - Joke Books




