#### Start of term reminders:

- Attendance students need to be at school to learn and develop social skills. Some days it may seem hard to get children off to school but it is vital to develop good habits. If there is something bothering your child, please contact the teacher or Assistant Principal to talk about it so it can be worked through to support good attendance.
- We strongly encourage students wear *uniform* particularly their tops that were provided

last year. Uniforms enhance student belonging and positive school culture. For excursions uniforms help with safety and students going on excursions are required to be in uniform unless otherwise stated.

• We are continuing to update and document policies, procedures, and guidelines. Staff have worked on "Homework Guidelines" and SRC will discuss the guidelines as well. The guidelines provide a commonsense approach to Homework and are not onerous. When we distribute the document, we encourage you to develop a routine for children to complete tasks.

- **Communications** we endeavour to provide a range of communications to connect with families:

**EDSMART** – emails broadcasts and consent forms. Please ensure you reply "yes" or "no" for consents so we can manage transport etc.

**Newsletters** – Week 3, 6 and 9 each term. They are on the website and the link is emailed when they are available. Hard copies are in the Front Office, the Community Library, Foodland, and the Post Office. You can request that we give one to your child to take home.

**Unexplained absences** – if your child is away and we have not received a reason you will be texted.

**Any urgent messages** – e.g., bus information – families will be texted.

Noticeboard on the hill – upcoming events are advertised on the noticeboard.

Parent/family groups – PaCCS – is reactivating meeting in the library, it is a great way to find out more about the school and learning programs. Isobell Koolmatrie has an Aboriginal Parent Group meeting at both Meningie Area School and Raukkan Aboriginal School. Governing Council has responsibility to oversee school directions, policy, and finances. It meets twice per term with the agenda covering reports, policy development and provide family and community perspectives in the school.

#### **Community Portal and FROG**

We are moving towards opening these very soon. Community Portal links to our administrative system and will allow families to notify of absences, update contact and health information. FROG is the learning platform and will provide families a window into the classroom and at secondary the ability to see students' assessment information.

We will run several sessions at various times to help you become familiar with the platforms and we promise it will be worth the wait.

• **Phone** – we do understand that not everyone is comfortable with digital communication. You can pop in or phone the Front Office between 8am and 4:00pm for help with anything.

#### Year 7 Science - BEES

The year 7 science students are studying plant partnership with bees. Thanks to the generosity of Bill and Natalie Brown owners of Coorong Gold who donated a colony of bees. The students enjoyed working alongside Bill to move the bees from one hive to their flow hive.

I was impressed and proud of the student's clam and confident approach when moving the frames from a beehive to their flow hive. The students were very eager in developing their hand on skills in managing a beehive.



It was exciting to see the student's curious minds be activated. This was shown through the types of questions and conversation they were having with Bill. A highlight was seeing the queen bee and learning some practical skills.

The students are excited to investigate a section of the frames next week, where they will get to try some of the honey. We



might have some more beekeeper in the town in the coming years with their enthusiasm, interest and ability to work calmly with the bees. The students look forward to continuing to develop our bee husbandry skill.


