Principal's report from Fiona Haselgrove

Friday 7th March 2025



We are well into the term and learning programs are gaining momentum. The primary team are focusing on literacy collaborating with a coach from the DfE Literacy Guarantee Unit. A music education team will work with R-3 classes to model using music in the classroom for regulation and learning. In secondary the year 8-12 have started on their Enterprise subject and are preparing to pitch their ideas.

Parents and families will be invited to attend our "interviews" in week 10 and 11 (31/3 to 10/4). The focus will be different this year, students will present their learning to their homegroup teacher and family members. Primary students will talk about work samples and secondary students will prepare a presentation over weeks 7-9. The presentation will highlight work they are proud of, areas for improvement and how their learning aligns with the school values. The purpose is for students to take the lead in their learning and develop more responsibility for their learning. EdSmart will be used for bookings.



Through the use of classroom resources, such as paddle pop sticks and marble runs, students are able to engage with STEM learning. This develops their problem-solving skills, emotional regulation and social skills, as well as their hand-eye coordination, fine motor skills and understanding of the world around them.

Why is there still play when students get to school?

When students start their formal schooling journey, it is often expected that students will only play at recess and lunch. When the adults reframe 'play' to 'student-led inquiry' we start to understand why play is essential in junior primary. Play is where children learn how to learn. They learn how to cooperate, to negotiate, to problem solve. When they have a problem in their play, they learn to stick at it and be persistent. Children will face so many challenges in school and in life - social challenges, academic challenges, emotional challenges. It's probably the most important thing we can give our children - to be persistent and resilient when things are not easy or straightforward. Play is where this gets a good work out and gets strong.

Play is where we get students engaged in learning topics and thinking more deeply about the world around them. It's how we connect with nature and learn to take care of our environment, where we learn to think critically and creatively and develop our foundational skills for our school journey, such as hand gross and fine motor skills, hand strength, exploring new vocabulary and learn to work with others. When educators carefully curate play situations, they are embedding the Australian Curriculum into the natural way children explore conecpts while developing those key, foundational learning skills.

Amie and Lili talked about their new books The Isles of the Gods and Unhallowed halls and the school now has 2 signed copies in the library of these 2 books for loan.









World Autism Awareness Day April 2nd










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School Photo Day – Monday 17th March 2025




