Welcome to Term 2. Staff are working hard on finalising the School Learning Plan 2025-26 aligned to the Department for Education Strategy, to prioritise our learning improvement strategies. The work is around:

- Learning intentions and success criteria teachers ensuring students know what they are learning, why they are learning it and how they will know they are successful.
- Feedback teacher to student, student to student and self-assessment.
- Student conferences students leading the conversation with parents/family members on their learning progress. We are asking for feedback on this process – please use the link to provide feedback: https://forms.office.com/r/HsLPQqaxK4
- Homework guidelines this guideline provides expectations for students, staff and families. The finalised document is on our website: MAS-Homework-Guideline Please read the document and support students to develop routines for learning at home.
- Literacy Statement this document will clearly outline the approaches to literacy across R-12, consistent practices teachers will use including the work of the DfE Literacy Unit and the Writing Revolution. We have a goal to increase the amount of writing students do across the school.
- Wellbeing continue to develop students' sense of belonging and resilience to improve attendance and learning. This builds on the work we have done with the Berry Street Education Model and the Zones of Regulation.

We will share the School Learning Plan with the school community shortly. The FROG Learner Management System will support this work – particularly in secondary.

The assignment module will allow teachers to set up rubrics/performance standards for feedback and collect student self-assessment to ensure students reflect on their learning. The App which we are still waiting for, will allow primary teachers to upload work samples to individual portfolios for parents/families to see progress.

Leaders are also looking at the various funding for supporting students with learning needs and are working to ensure the funding is used to best improve learning outcomes. Some funding is used to maintain lower class sizes, some for leadership in student support, some for professional learning of staff and a large proportion of it for employing SSO's to support students in the classroom. The review will ensure we are strategic with the funding and getting the best outcomes for our students.

This work is intertwined and takes persistence and time to come together. We restructured our leadership in 2024, and this structure is now embedded and providing clear roles and responsibilities to action improvement. The leaders are now in their stride and working with teaching and support staff to develop a coherent curriculum with clear teaching and learning strategies. We look forward to sharing the success of these strategies through a range of data sets and feedback.


Chess Club




